Indian Lake Beach Rules

Members must wear or display their membership badges at all times while on club property. Anyone living within the boundaries of Indian Lake must be a member of the club to be on club property (beaches, boats, and playgrounds). Members must register guests with the lifeguards. Members will be responsible for the actions of their guests.

The beaches are open daily 10-7 from mid-June until Labor Day as long as there are lifeguards available. The clubhouse Beach will be swim at your own risk after 7 or if lifeguards are not present. When Franklin Road Beach and Main Beach are locked, it is considered trespassing to be on the beach and the authorities will be called.

Children 12 and under must be accompanied by a parent or a responsible guardian at the beaches. Parents or guardians are required to supervise their children at all times.

Swimming and diving is permitted only in designated areas.
All children 12 and under must complete the swim test at the Main Beach in order to swim and dive unaccompanied by an adult or guardian. The swim test will be administered by the Beach Manager or an experienced lifeguard. The swim test consists of: swimming unaided from the beach steps to the far ropes, coming back a few feet, treading water for 1 minute, and then swimming back to the steps.

No rough play in swimming area.
No small ball playing on crowded beach. Ball playing should be done on the playgrounds or grass areas.
No excessive splashing near adults or small children.
No fishing in the swimming areas.
No Alcoholic beverages are permitted on the beach during hours of operation.
No smoking is permitted on the beach. There are ashtrays provide just outside of the beach area.
No dogs are allowed on the beaches at any time.

Please do not leave any personal belongings on the beach. (towels, chairs, toys, etc.)

All boats must have current tags. Please try to find a place on a boat rack for your non-power boat or place them in the area of the racks.
No boats are permitted in the swimming areas.

NJ STATE SANITARY CODE REGULATION 8:26:5.4(A, B): Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days. All children in diapers must wear swimming diapers. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.

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
